MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Since our founding 11 years ago, NEACOL has positively impacted the lives of over 24,000 children through 41 projects and \$425,000 USD in donations. In 2024, as we celebrated our 11th anniversary, we reached milestones that will help us strengthen and expand our mission, bringing hope and support to even more Colombian children in need.

In 2024, NEACOL supported five projects – four in Colombia and one in Massachusetts – benefiting approximately 1,000 children.

- Resguardo Indígena El Volao in Necoclí, Antioquia: This project provided clean water to indigenous children by installing 17 water filters (each with a 60-liter capacity) in nine schools within the community.
- Ángeles Somos in Arroyo Grande, Cartagena: This initiative promoted sustainable food production for children and families through agricultural projects.
- Corporación Proyectándote al Futuro in Corregimiento Llano Rico, Chocó: Focused on improving early childhood nutrition, this project emphasized the critical importance of proper nutrition for young children.
- Altos del Cabo by Fondacio in the Eastern Mountains of Bogotá: This program supported holistic human development and environmental sustainability.
- ConEducación Corp through the Paving My Way to College program in Massachusetts: In partnership with the Consulate of Colombia in Massachusetts, this program helped Colombian students access higher education by providing 40 hours of workshops, virtual sessions with families, ongoing English classes, and scholarships for English courses and higher education opportunities.

These initiatives reflected NEACOL's commitment to empowering communities and creating lasting opportunities for children in need.

In 2024, NEACOL hosted events that strengthened our community and mission.

ABOUT US

NEACOL is a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit Organization based in Massachusetts, comprised of Colombians and friends of Colombia committed to volunteering and collaborating to support social initiatives for the benefit of Colombian children. Our goals are to generate innovative ideas, raise awareness, and channel resources to provide a better quality of life for Colombian children in need. The three areas of focus for NEACOL are education, health and nutrition.

OUR MISSION

NEACOL'S mission is to generate resources to support social programs and unite efforts that will contribute to improving life conditions of Colombian children in need.

OUR VISION

A more prosperous life for Colombian children.

OUR HISTORY

In 2012, a group of friends in Boston along with the consul of Colombia Monica Pinzon explored this question. They realized that they could make a social and economic impact on the daily life of thousands of Colombian children who were living in poverty. This is how the New England Association for Colombian Children (NEACOL) was born. The goal was to channel resources from the New England area that addressed needs for Education, Health and Nutrition for children in Colombia.

The idea is now supported throughout the world by many Colombians and friends of Colombia who wanted to invest socially in programs to improve the life conditions of children in need.

In December 2014, NEACOL received the official 501(c)(3) status as a nonprofit organization based in Massachusetts. The same year, NEACOL provided its first grant to fund an initiative in education. This first project impacted the lives of 270 impoverished children from Valle del Cauca, Colombia. As of 2024, we have committed to \$425,000 to 41 projects serving 24,000 children in need.





GRANT PROGRAM: MALNUTITION

Funding Priorities

The New England Association for Colombian Children's (NEACOL) grant program serves our mission: to provide financial resources to support programs that contribute to improving the living conditions of Colombian children in need. NEACOL's grant program addresses three broad areas aligned with its mission: health, education, and nutrition. The 2024/2025 Call for Proposals provided funding to health organizations meeting the needs of children up to 18 years old experiencing malnutrition.

The Health Ministry warned of the potential exacerbation of childhood health situations with the climate phenomenon of El Niño: increased droughts and effects on the agricultural activity for food production. The OPS calls for the strengthening of timely attention to the at-risk population, requiring medical staff training, education materials, and medical supplies.

Application Process

Applications for grants are submitted in a two-step process.

The first step is the submission of a Letter of Interest that briefly describes the project. NEACOL reviews these letters and selects a short list of projects that best meet our organization's mission and goals.

The second step is the submission of a more extensive, detailed proposal by the short listed organizations, from which NEACOL selects grant recipients.

GRANT PROGRAM: MALNUTITION

ORGANIZATION ELIGIBILITY

Projects will be judged on the ability of the organizations to meet the eligibility criteria established by NEACOL for 2025.

NEACOL seeks to award grants where the amount invested can have a significant and verifiable impact. When reviewing grant proposals, NEACOL will consider the following:

- The organization must be a legitimate nonprofit charitable organization, such as a 501(c)(3) corporation.
- The organization must have a sound plan for using the funds to strengthen its capacity to benefit Colombian children's nutritional needs.
- Proposal completeness, clarity, and conciseness.
- The organization must provide evidence that the project can reasonably be expected to meet its goals.
- Funds requested must be consistent with the project's goals and the size of the target population it benefits. Proposed projects must have a start date of January 2, 2025.
- · Size of the population benefited by the project.
- The organization must provide evidence that grant funds will help secure future funding, support an affiliation, ensure stability, or achieve other benefits.
- Organizations that have received grants from NEACOL are eligible to apply; however, priority will be given to those that have never received a grant from NEACOL.
- Grant funds are not intended to support annual operating expenses.
- · A cost-effective project impact evaluation.

Additional considerations:

• Potential to ensure successful program implementation by sharing costs with other sources since NEACOL funds may not be sufficient.

REVIEW PROCESS

NEACOL's Project Committee reviews all letters of intent and extended proposals, the evaluation process will take up to four months to complete. The Project committee will select the finalists and present their recommendations to NEACOL's Board of Directors. Proposals that do not meet the application deadlines or grant guidelines will be eliminated. Applicants who are rejected will be promptly notified. Applicants who are selected for a grant award will be notified by email.
